

## **Pupil Personnel Services: School Psychology Preconditions**

### **1. Bachelor's Degree (Ed Code §44266)**

Persons admitted to programs must have a minimum of a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited college or university.

#### **Program Response:**

#### ***Credential-Only Programs:***

- PPS Credential in School Psychology
  - Master's degree in a related field from a regionally accredited institution

#### ***Degree + Credential Programs:***

- Master of Arts in Education in School Psychology with PPS Credential Program Specific Admissions Requirements
  - Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution
- Education Specialist in School Psychology with PPS Credential Program Specific Admissions Requirements
  - Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution

Alliant International University Admission Requirements are processed through the Application Processing Center (APC). Here, potential Candidates for programs within CSOE are vetted and only those applicants who meet the minimum required qualifications as described on our website are eligible to continue in the enrollment process.

### **2. Program Curriculum**

A college or university that operates a program of professional preparation shall have a curriculum that meets the appropriate requirement as follows:

A program of study for the **school psychologist specialization** shall be: Equivalent to a minimum of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units; or 900 classroom hours of postgraduate study.

#### **Program Response:**

PPS School Psychology Candidates will be required to successfully complete the following number of semester units of postbaccalaureate studies for completion of the PPS School Psychology credential program:

- [Education Specialist Degree + PPS School Psychology Credential with an emphasis in School Based Mental Health](#): 78 semester units
- [MAE + PPS School Psychology Credential](#): 60 semester units
- [PPS School Psychology Credential Only](#): 60 semester units

### 3. For Intern Programs

An entity that operates an approved program of preparation for a PPS credential with an Intern option shall require each candidate who is admitted into the Intern Program to have completed sufficient coursework so that the candidate is ready for supervised practice in the schools. The Intern must be supervised and supported by both the employer and the Commission-approved program.

Prior to gaining eligibility for an Internship Credential at a partnering school/school district while completing Internship courses, PPS School Psychology Candidates are required to successfully complete all of the following requirements:

- All initial pedagogy courses
- All Practicum Courses, including obtaining a minimum of 450 hours of practicum experience in P-12 school settings and clinical/community settings.
- Passing Score on the [Comprehensive Praxis Exam](#)
