Mild/Moderate Support Needs: instructional setting where a teacher or Education Specialist is assigned to a classroom or environment that is designated as "mild/moderate disabilities" or "mild-to-moderate support needs." Education Specialists are often within environments such as SDC (Special Day Class), RSP (Resource Specialist Program), or Push-In/Pull-Out Services.	CORE: instructional setting where a teacher is assigned on the basis of a credential that authorizes self-contained classroom instruction to teach 2 or more subjects for 2 or more periods per day to the SAME group of students in grades 5-8 OR SELF-CONTAINED CLASSROOM: instructional setting in which the teacher is responsible for teaching all subjects to a group of students (typically found at elementary grade level)	Departmentalized Classroom: A departmentalized classroom setting is one in which an instructor teaches a specific subject matter area to a group of students. The instructor may teach specific content to several different groups of students during multiple classes throughout the day. This is the classroom organization usually found in middle, junior, or high school settings, but may also be found at the elementary level in classes such as art, physical education, science, mathematics, and music.
